Introduction to Prevent, Teach, Reinforce for Young Children (PTR-YC)

PTR-YC is a manualized set of strategies for designing and implementing assessment-based interventions for children with the most significant challenging behaviors. This introductory training will provide child care staff with a basic overview of the process and strategies. It is not intended to support individuals who will implement PTR-YC. That support will be provided at the program-level. Teachers who are curious about PTR-YC and want to learn how it can support children with very challenging behaviors are encouraged to attend.
